#### PUDDLESDUCKS



What a fantastic half term we have had. The highlight of the term has to be the National Space Centre bringing in their Stardome for us to use for an entire day. Year 5 were allowed sole access to the Stardome where they discovered new information about the sun, Earth and moon. The moon's phases as well as Greek mythology. This was a fantastic opportunity that has enhance the children's knowledge and writing from it.

Secondly, we had the luxury of two days out of class completing our Bikeability modules. Most of the children succeeded in obtaining their level 1 and 2 bikeability which allows them to confidently and competently cycle on roads. The children absolutely loved the two days learning new things and a big thank you goes to the children for their outstanding behaviour as well as the Lincolnshire County Council for giving the class the opportunity for free.

Moving on, year 5 have developed their understanding and ability in writing nonchronological reports, the writing produced throughout class has been remarkably amazing. The writing is some of the best I have seen from the group. In addition to this, year 5 have been learning about multiplication and division, which has been a big step up in difficulty from year 4. They have shown awesome determination to progress and achieve highly which is evident in their end of term assessment results.


A huge well done to everyone in Year 5! You have done amazingly. Have a fantastic Christmas and a very, very happy new year!!



We have had a super term continuing to learn all about the Amazon Rainforest! We have looked at monsoons in the rainforest and what effect they have on the environment. We then looked at the 4 different layers: Emergent, Canopy, Understory and the Forest floor. Year 3 used their knowledge of amount of rain over the year and created a bar chart to show their results. In Art we have created our own rainforest animal masks- we will be bringing these home soon! This topic has now come to an end and we will be learning all about the Rotten Romans after Christmas.

In Literacy, we have looked at poetry. We looked at ta range of poetry pieces based in the rainforest including: tongue twisters, riddles, shape poems, rhyming and non-rhyming poems. This was really good fun to perform and then we wrote our own poems- these were great too! Secondly,

we looked at explanation texts. We had to use our key skills using fronted adverbials of time and casual conjunctions to write our own explanations from still images. We had to explain the actions and this was followed up watching the clip to see if we were close to being correct!



In Numeracy, we have been working really hard with our multiplication and division. We have worked so hard learning our multiplication tables, we then used these skills for the grid method- these questions are really tricky! Also, we needed our skills for short

division problems! We have finished the term solving investigations up in North Pole- there are some naughty elves up there!

Well done Year 3 for a fantastic term and I will see you in 2017!

Auturm Term In Preschool

First helf of our term in Preschool we have been looking at weather change and how it impacts our environment and the clothing we wear.

In the second part of our term we have been targeting phonics, with a focus on children's ability to recognise different sounds. As the term has come to an end we have become very creative with our christmas art. The children have also been extremely excited to see Santa has planted a Santa cam. This has resulted in the children being on their best behaviour in the hope that Santa's elves will pass on the message just in time for Christmas. We in Tall Oaks think Santa will be delivering lots of presents this year!

Last of all we would like to wish everybody Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year This term has been an extremely busy one for us in Year 4! We have worked hard to complete lots and lots of things.

In English, we have looked at poetry. We explored how poems can use rhyme, similes, onomatopoeia and even metaphors too! We were able to write our own poems in free verse about a special moment to remember. We even managed to link this to our topic of the Vikings and thought about how we might feel if we were arriving in Britain for the first time. For our non -fiction topic, we have been working hard on learning about recounts. Year four are able to explain the different features, including the 5Ws (we are very fast at reciting these!) We have just finished writing our own recounts about the birth of Jesus too.

In Maths, we have worked extremely well to understand the topic of multiplication and division. We first looked at mental methods and how we can

use our times tables to help us to answer some tricky questions. Then, we began to use formal written methods to solve harder problems. There were some really large numbers to multiply as well as there being some tricky numbers to divide (which sometimes left us with a remainder!) We have just completed our post-tests and all the children should be really pleased with the progress they have made.



In Science this term our topic was sound. We have discovered what makes sound, the difference between pitch and volume, the structure of the ear and how different ear shapes and sizes can help to improve the sound we hear. We created our own investigation to decide which one we think makes it easier for us to hear.

In Topic, we continued to learn about the Vikings and their invasion of Britain. We found out about the countries the Vikings came from and the longboats that they travelled in to come to Britain. We have also learnt about the different houses and clothes that the Viking wore as well as writing about how we might feel if the Vikings invaded a place we were in.

A great term Year Four! Well done, have a good rest and I look forward to seeing you next year! J



We've had a busy term as always with our learning focussing on reading and writing Traditional Tales, exploring letter writing, in maths, addition and subtraction and fractions as well as investigating materials in Science. Not to mention our wonderful Nativity Play.



The children are making great progress and are really blossoming in their enthusiasm for learning.
