It has been another busy term with PE and School Sport. The Year 5 children have had a Cricket coach in all term, developing their Cricket game playing skills. The children have worked hard to develop their batting, bowling and fielding skills. Four children took part in Quicksticks Hockey tournament, finishing in joint second place. This qualified them for the finals which took place a week later, where the team finished in 5th place.

Ten children from Year 3 and 4 went across to Governors field to take part in the annual Tri-Golf competition, they took part in ten different golfing activities, designed to improve putting and chipping as well as accuracy and power. The children thoroughly enjoyed themselves despite the cold and wet weather.

The Girls Cricket tournament took place this term. The girls travelled to Caythorpe and competed against 5 other schools. They played a round robin of games, winning four games and only losing one. After a count back of wickets lost the Church Lane team were crowned the winners. The team are pictured below with the Young Leaders who officiated the event and David who runs Caythorpe Cricket Club.

The Football team finished off the league with a mini tournament. Winning two games and drawing the third the team were victorious and went away with gold medals.

Finally to finish off a fantastic term, the Netball team were awarded gold medals for winning the Sleaford and District Sports Association Netball league, they did this in style winning 4 games and losing just the one. Well done to all who played in any fixtures over the year.

There are still a number of events coming up before the end of term, Year 6 pupils will be taking part in a Cricket tournament, Year 3 and 4 will have their first Friendly football match against Leasingham and all of Year 5 and 6 will be competing in a Sky Go-ride cycling competition.

YEAR 5

This term Year 5 have been learning about Buddhism. They have learnt the art of meditation (some more able than others!) and have made and tasted sweet rice that Buddhists give as an offering during festivals and special occasions. They have also made and taken home their own Wesak lantern.

Our topic focus has been Ancient Egyptians and the children have really enjoyed looking at the gory process of mummification (in particular pulling the brain out with a hook through the nose). They have learnt about the importance of the River Nile and the reign of Tutankhamun, This has been linked with their literacy where they have written a biography and a news paper article about Howard Carter and the discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb. The focus on the Egyptian era linked nicely to our RE and British Values project for the term -The story of focus is Joseph and his Technicolour Dreamcoat.

Year 5 have used the bibles to read the story and they are now creating a piece of art linking the story and the importance of tolerance together. We are also going to learn a few songs from then well-known Broadway show. Let's see if we have any Jason Donovan's in the class!

We have discovered that the Year 5 class have a great interest in Geography and they have learnt how to use a map and locate other important rivers in the UK. The children have made their own travel leaflet for a country of their choice. They have researched the country's flag, language, currency and key tourist attractions.

In Science the children have been looking at soluble and insoluble materials. They have been planning and undertaking their own science experiments. We will be continuing to develop their investigative skills in the final term whilst looking at Light and Sound.

In Math the children have been refining their skills in basic number work. They have executed the skill of addition and subtraction and are focusing at the moment on formal methods of division and multiplication. They have also been looking at the dreaded fractions with plenty of visual clues designed by Mr Clay.

A big congratulations to the girls who went to a cricket competition and returned to school with gold medals! Well done Maddy, Alicia and Katie.

Next term we have lots to look forward to - Ancient Greeks, WW1, The Olympics, Anthems and composing music are just to name a few!



YEAR 4


This term Year 4 have been writing about different cultures in Literacy, particularly Pakistan. We have read the story 'Sugarcane Juice' based around a young boy working for his father on his Sugarcane juice stall. We have taken on board the differences in lifestyles between those living in other countries and ourselves. Subsequently, we have created some incredible stories! It is safe to say ALL of the children have written their best piece of work since entering Year 4! We will be looking at persuasion writing next, we hope to persuade Mr Clay to allow us to wear non-uniform for the whole of the summer term!

During Numeracy this year we have been conquering Geometry. This has challenge all of us in different ways, from remember lots and lots of different shape to translating those shapes through 4 quadrants. Next term we will move on to Fractions – there may be cake/chocolate involved!!

Vicious Vikings was the order of this term. We have discovered how the Vikings initially came over to our shores and where else they invaded along the way. We learnt that they stole from many British churches and sold the good as far away as Turkey. We have extended our knowledge on how they used to live and eat in their longhouses. We will continue to look at what role the Vikings played in the growth of Lincolnshire.

Next term we are going to become ancient Egyptians – looking into the development of their culture as well as learning all about their eating habits and living conditions.

In science, we have taken a look at the human body, in particular the digestive system and teeth. We have created posters on how to keep our teeth healthy and the benefits of healthy teeth. We have also discovered what happens when our body is unwell and how what we eat turns into poo!! We will be continuing learning about the body next term, however, it will be mainly based around the animal digestive system and their teeth.

This term the children have been very caring towards their friends, the insects and towards the babies in the role play area. We have introduced a doctor's surgery in the room for the children to understand roles of professionals in a caring environment.



Little Acorns children have been spending a lot of time out in the garden and exploring the natural objects by creating their own fire camp, tunnels and houses.




TALL OAKS

This term we have been looking at Spring time and what happens during this time. "The Hungry Caterpillar" story has been a big influence for the children. We read the story and discussed how the caterpillar changes into a beautiful butterfly. Art work included tiny green caterpillars and beautifully coloured butterflies. This even encouraged the children to explore our garden and find insects where they were amazed to find hundreds of baby ladybirds nesting in the tree. We have finished the term with some lovely real life painting.



YEAR 3

What another great term we have had! This term in Year 3 we have been learning all about the Rotten Romans. This has involved looking at the ruling system, how the Romans expanded, why the army were so great, Year 3 even had a go at marching in legion formation! Following this we looked at the how they invaded Britain and finally the events leading to Boudicca's rebellion. In Art, we have looked at a range of Mosaics and recreated our own using card.



In Literacy, we have been learning all about folktales. We researched where our Folktale was from in order to help us write our own, which are amazing! Following this we then looking at biographies and autobiographies. We looked at Jamila Gavin's life story (who wrote our Folktale) and created a biography of her living.



In Numeracy, we have been working really hard understanding shape. We have looked at 2D and 3D shapes and their properties, parallel and perpendicular lines. Year 3 have also looked at fractions, we have focused on simple fractions finding halves and quarters. We can add and subtract fractions and find fractions of quantities.

YEAR 1

What a busy term! The topic Year 1 chose as a theme was It's a Kind of Magic....and it truly has been a magical experience. We've focused on the story 'Room on the Broom' by Julia Donaldson in our Literacy lessons and have written letters (including ones from the dragon!), newspaper reports with exciting headlines and we've even had a go at changing the story completely and making our own new characters. We've also looked at 'Memory Bottles' by Beth Shoshan and wrote about our own memories using our senses, and worked on the poem '10 Things Found in a Wizard's Pocket' where we imagined the things found in a witch's hat.



In Numeracy this term it's been all about measuring. We've learnt how to measure how long or tall something is, how wide or narrow, as well as how it might be weighed and all about capacity. We can use standard and non-standard units of measurement and have measured pretty much everything in our classroom! We've also done lots of work on time, we know the days of the week and months of the year and we can also tell the time in analogue and digital to o'clock and half past. Lots of us can do quarter past and quarter to too!

We're really proud of the impressive canvas we've created in our RE lessons, all about Jesus and the 12 Disciples. Year 1 have also worked hard at focusing on our British Value, 'Respecting our Differences'. What a kind class we are! In Science we've been scientists investigating lots of different experiments and learning how to make sensible predictions. We've had lots of fun putting raisins into lemonade and making magical potions erupt with vinegar and baking soda!

In our ICT lessons we've been perfecting our sketching skills using the online channel Art Hub for Kids. So far we've drawn cats, monsters, ninjas and Russian dolls, what super artists! In our Geography lessons we've focused on our local area, looking at the types of houses we live in and what facilities we have in our town. We have also been enjoying hearing about the adventures of Travelling Ted. He'll continue to go home with children in the class after the half term holiday (and he's very excited about that!).
